Dear Clients and Friends,

Spring may be almost here, but for us out in southern Alberta, it's been like summer since mid-February. There were several days of T-shirts and shorts weather when we were the envy of the country. I've never seen a Chinook this strong or long, and if this keeps up, there will be no spring runoff in our neighbourhood. Farmers, on the other hand, dread this, since there's practically no moisture in the ground to start the busy seeding season. Having lived in a rural area for almost 20 years, I've learned that farming is one of the hardest businesses to endure, and it's not for everybody.

In my last newsletter, I told you that I'd like to provide more timely information on what's going on in the world to help you better plan your taxes and more. While farmers may have it hard, the world in general has become a harder place too, with no sign of relief. I find it interesting that the U.S. election this time around is making our front pages even though it's still six months away. With the upheaval in the establishment, front-runner Donald Trump has become amazingly popular in a short time. I don't believe this is isolated or a coincidence. Trump may be a loose cannon, but more importantly, he represents an awakening movement not just in the U.S. but all over the world.

For years, people have rightly suspected that the media has not been reporting the true news. It's no wonder [many of them are on the verge of going bust](#) while at the same time start-ups like [The Rebel](#), launched in 2015, are exploding and can barely keep up. I'm a big fan of the free media, not just because it's no cost but more importantly

because it's uncontrolled. With technology like [smartphones forecasted to fall in price to pennies](#), everyone can participate. You can even start your own channels, etc. Believe it or not, there are many who make a full-time living at it, beginning with no experience. So consider this business opportunity.

One of the big issues becoming publicly known is that central banking is not a government institution, but rather is privately owned by conglomerates. The coins are guaranteed redeemable like ordinary currency in Canada, but with two bonuses: First, if silver goes through the roof,

they instantly increase in value. Second, all collector coins appreciate over time if kept in proof condition. So it's hard to lose. I've been buying almost all I can each year. Some of my 2009 coin investments have already gained almost 50% just sitting on the shelf—and that's in a stable market.

### 2016 Federal Budget Almost Here

Finance Minister Bill Morneau will present the Trudeau government's first budget on Tuesday, March 22, after the markets close at 16:00 EST.

Many financial experts, like Kevin O'Leary, are expecting it to be bad news, with record deficits, taxes and burdens on the middle class. O'Leary even goes so far as to say that the prime minister's policies are "reckless" for the next generation. In Canada, residency plays a major part in determining the taxes you pay. While residents are entitled to some credits and deductions, non-residents generally have fewer obligations. - benefit and credit payment dates
- a directory of E-File tax professionals
- a listing of free tax-filing software
- the date and location of Community Volunteer Income Tax Program clinics
- the CRA's charities listings and more, making it easier to choose and donate wisely to a registered charity.

## Laid Off at Tax Time

Real People with Real Questions About Real Situations



Dear Neel,

I was downsized from my oil rig job last year, and things are very dreary in my industry. My wife and I have had to resort to the food bank and help from

friends and family just to make ends meet. I'm between a rock and a hard place since the \$25,000 I set aside for 2015 taxes is all we have. I'm thinking of not filing until things pick up. What's the best way to approach this? I've always been current on my filings and don't want to cause any waves.

Dear Syd,

I wish there was an easy answer to your situation. This picture is becoming very common in our world and may be even bleaker than is being reported. It's particularly widespread among small business owners like you who are uncertain about what's happening in their trade. While there is no program to put off filing taxes, I always suggest filing the return at the last date, which is Wednesday, June 15, 2016. It usually takes a few weeks to process, and at that point you can determine what to start paying.

The collections department can be reached at 1-888-863-8657. You can make instalments, though interest will be charged. If you can come up with an acceptable payment plan, you can also apply for taxpayer relief on the interest and other charges. If you qualify, you'll likely owe only the original \$25,000. In most cases, CRA wants to get paid within 12 months after the due date, but that's not written in stone. I recommend getting a loan as a backup plan in case they can't accommodate you.

Lastly, do not miss a payment, as they can seize assets, etc., without notice. And make sure you notify them if something comes up to prevent you from paying. In this economy, payment plans are becoming more common and a win/win for both parties. Hope this helps!
