

Look to the sky this month to check out the Leonid meteor shower, Seven Sisters star cluster

Sky's the Limit

On Friday, Nov. 11 before sunrise, look west as the moon and Mars will still be visible at daybreak.

The Leonid meteor shower peaks at 5 p.m. on Thursday, Nov.

17. Originating from the comet 55P/Tempel-Tuttle, it should produce meteors at the rate of 10-15 per hour. A new moon with no light will provide a spectacular view.

On Friday, Nov. 18 before sunset, look northeast-east as the Pleiades, or Seven Sisters, star cluster rises all night right into daybreak before setting in the north-northwest.

On Monday, Nov. 28 after sunset, look south-southeast as the moon and Saturn set into the night.
