

Several sky events to see this month

The Zodiacal Light is a faint, roughly triangular, whitish glow seen in the night sky extended up from the vicinity of the sun along the ecliptic or zodiac. The best time to see it is until mid-February in the evening in the west.

Betelgeuse, the Valentine star is visible on Valentine's Day, starting in the southeast-east from dusk until it sets in the west after 3:30 a.m. Impress your date by showing them this easy-to-find red pulsating star, which is Ori-

on's shoulder.

Before sunrise on Saturday, Feb.

17, you'll see these Saturn, Mars and Jupiter lined up to the south on an angle, with the red planet in the middle.

Look northeast-east on Friday, Feb. 23 at dusk as the moon will follow Aldebaran, an orange giant star, overnight until setting at around 3 a.m. in the northwest-west.
