

Mainstream media UFO stories intrigues public

1. Full Moon with bright Mars- Friday, July 27th look SE after 22:00 as they stay up all night.
2. Dawn Aldebaran Lunar Occult- Tuesday, July 10th before sunrise, look NEE after 3:00 Am and the Moon rose with the hidden star until it was revealed before 05:00 AM.
3. Venus and Crescent Moon set- Monday, July 16th look West after sunset as they set into the midnight horizon.
4. Delta Aquarids Meteor Shower Peak- Friday July 27th look in the constellation Aquarius 1-2 hours before dawn as it expected debris from comet 96P Machholz will fall at a rate of 15-20 per hour. Unfortunately, the full Moon make it hard to enjoy.
