On Friday, Aug. 18 before sunset, look southwest-west and watch Mars and the moon duo set into the night after 9 p.m.

Sunday, Aug. 13 after dark will be the peak of the annual Perseids meteor shower, with an estimated rate of 144 meteors per hour. However, the moon, in Aquarius, will be only two days past full phase at the shower's peak, presenting significant interference throughout the night. The best time to view is starting at 11 p.m. facing the north-northeast in the constellation of Perseids until dawn

On Saturday, Aug. 26 before
sunset, look southwest-west – if
you have a good telescope, you
can see the rings of Saturn in
daylight, which is a treat. Saturn
can be seen from 6:38 p.m. before
it sets at 6:42 p.m.

August is an excellent month to view our home galaxy, the Milky Way, without freezing. The best time is after 11 p.m. until dawn.
