Fall meteor shower signals longer night skies

Sky watch for the next month:

- Northern Taurids Meteor Shower Peaks — Tuesday, Nov. 11 after dark forecast is seven meteors per hour and noticeable since the Moon is down.
- Leonid Meteor Shower Peaks Tuesday, Nov. 17 after night fall until dawn looking towards the constellation of Leo. Originating from the comet 55P/Tempel-Tuttle, it should produce meteors at the rate of 10-15 per hour.
- Saturn and Sun Rise Conjunction Tuesday, Nov. 18 look for the morning sunrise SEE around 8 a.m. with sun filters on your binoculars to catch Saturn going across the sun.
